Under the provisions of the IPC's approval, it is the Organizing Committee's responsibility to deliver an Anti-Doping programme. This Anti-Doping programme shall in accordance with the scope, the size and the make up of the Event.

The Anti-Doping programme needs to be conducted in compliance with the World Anti-Doping Code (WADC) and the WADC International Standards for Testing (IST).

* An Anti-Doping Organization (ADO) as defined in the WADC, is "a Signatory that is responsible for adopting rules for initiating, implementing or enforcing any part of Doping Control process. This includes, for example, the International Olympic Committee, the International Paralympic Committee, other Major Event Organizations that conduct Testing at their Events, WADA, International Federations, and National Anti-Doping Organizations."



In providing the Anti-Doping programme, particular attention should be given to the WADC articles 15.3 and 15.3.1.

“Except as provided in Article 15.3.1, results management and hearings shall be the responsibility of and shall be governed by the procedural rules of the Anti-Doping Organization that initiated and directed Sample Collection (or, if no Sample Collection is involved, the organization that discovered the violation). If that authority does not have the authority to conduct results management, then results management authority shall default to the applicable International Federation (...).”

WADC, article 15.3

“Results management and the conduct of hearings for an anti-doping rule violation arising from a test by, or discovered by, a National Anti-Doping Organization involving an Athlete who is not a national, resident, license-holder or member of a sport organization of that country shall be administered as directed by the rules of the applicable International federation (...).”

WADC, article 15.3.1

In terms of reporting, the Anti-Doping Organization* shall notify the International Federation (IF) and the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) on the outcome of any investigation on possible anti-doping rule violations in accordance with the provisions set forth in WADC article 14.1.2.
